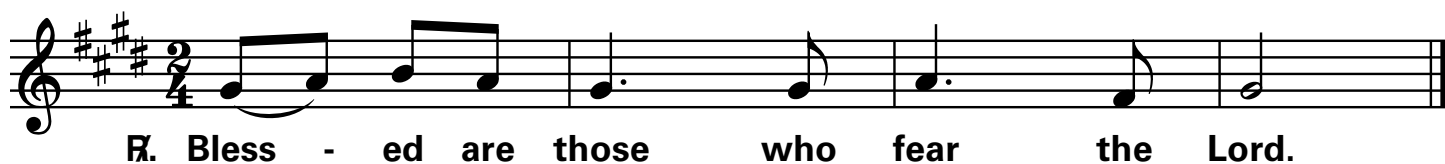
First Reading


